Definition of Good Governance

"The framework and culture within which a sports body sets policy, delivers its strategic objectives, engages with stakeholders, monitors performance, evaluates and manages risk and reports to it constituents on its activities and progress including the delivery of effective, sustainable and proportionate sports policy and regulation".

1. Clarity of purpose/objectives

- Clarity on role, function and objectives
- Identify and communicate goals
- Set out vision and strategic plan
- Generate consensual approach
- Apply monitoring/oversight capabilities

2. Code of ethics

- Develop binding code for all members
- ☐ Embrace full range of ethical practices to inform conduct/culture of the sports body
- ☐ Focus on integrity, equity, transparency and acceptable conduct
- Apply implementation/enforcement protocol

3. Stakeholder identification and roles

- Involvement of stakeholders is key
- Minimum standards for stakeholder representation should be in place
- Appropriate commitment from stakeholders
- ☐ Formalise stakeholder's roles/ responsibilities

4. Democracy and minimum standards

- Clear organisational framework and rules
- Role and rights of members must be clear
- ☐ Free, fair and regular elections
 - Credible/transparent voting process
 - Publicise decisions wherever possible
- Clarity of role/powers of President or Chair
- Code of conduct for decision makers
 - High ethical practices
 - Act independently in interests of sports body
 - Not take part where a business or personal interest exists

5. Delegation/Committees

- Promote efficiency through delegation
- ☐ Use technical and/or expert committees
- Clear lines of responsibility should exist
- ☐ An effective Board structure should be in place with financial oversight responsibilities

6. Management

- ☐ Critical role of the Board set culture
- ☐ Act in the best interest of the sport
- Independent
- □ Diversity of Board gender etc
- ☐Term limits
- □ Conflict policies

7. Judicial/disciplinary procedures

- Proportionate judicial/disciplinary code
- ☐ Impartial adjudicators skills and expertise
- ☐ Create an appropriate appeal framework
- ☐ Swift cost effective, expert sports specific resolutions

8. Inclusivity and youth engagement

- Represent diverse nature of society/sport
- ☐ Gender, race, sexuality, disability, age etc.
- Select from widest possible talent pool
- Apply robust inclusivity strategy
- Engage with youth groups/IT critical
- ☐ Talent ID and management leaders of tomorrow establish your network and experience

9. Statutes, rules and regulations

- ☐ Make public statutes, rules and regulations
- □ Consult on amendments
- ☐ Meet European law expectations
- ☐ Evidence based consultation
- Utilisation of websites

10. Accountability and transparency

- ☐ Clear oversight act within powers
- ☐ Fit for purpose internal controls, data protection policies and financial management/reporting strategies
- Clear financial authorisation limit
- ☐ Produce annual report and document/financial distributions

C. EU policy activities in the field

- ☐ Funding of projects:
 - Under preparatory actions (2011 + 2013)=> 9 projects
 - O Under Erasmus+ Sport:
 - 2 projects in 2014
 - 3 projects in 2015
 - 1 project in 2016
- Next year 25% of the budget will be dedicated to GG (including integrity)



- Based on IOC and EU principles and Agenda 2020
- Target groups: NOCs and National federations
- Outcome: Self-evaluation tool and concrete Action Plans

- Methodology:
- 4 principles => Integrity, Accountability, Transparency and Democracy, inclusivity and participation
- 20 Headlines
- Self-assessment with 40 questions (strengths/ weaknesses)
- 5 Level for each question / Headline
- Customised Action Plan combines in an online tool
